In November's webcast, we had Brandi Hays, a special education teacher at Smith County High School, talk with us about school-based enterprises. She has created multiple school-based enterprises and currently has two at her school now, a dye sublimation business and a vinyl operation business. These provide students with prior work experience before graduating and going to find a job in the community. Brandi spoke about what to consider before and after starting your own school-based enterprise. Many of her students have gotten jobs related to what they've done at the school-based enterprise after graduation.

- ☐ Before starting a school-based enterprise, you need to make sure it is suitable for your students.
